Confessional Address & Corporate Confession

- I confess to God Almighty, before the whole company of heaven and before you, my brothers and sisters, ... In the Name and for the sake of Jesus. Amen.
- God Almighty knows your sin, and for the sake of His beloved Son, Jesus Christ, He grants you pardon, forgiveness, He releases of all your sins, and promises His Spirit to strengthen you and give you faith. Amen.

G I confess to God Almighty, before the whole company of heaven and before you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned by my fault, by my own fault, by my own most grievous fault. God's Holy Law shows that my sin is not only outward, the words I speak and the things I do, but my sin is also inward. I see the thoughts of my heart where there is secret pride and evil desire, anger, hatred, malice and many other sins some of which only God knows. God's Law rightly condemns me as guilty and deserving only of His wrath and punishment. I desire to do better, but I do not find the strength in myself to make it so. Therefore I pray to God Almighty to have mercy on me, to forgive my guilt, to release me from sin's power, to increase my faith, to give me the strength to change my life and to carry me to everlasting life. Absolution will be applied <u>individually</u> to each penitent. Those desiring to receive Christ's forgiveness and blessing will be ushered forward. To maintain "social distancing," family groups should alternate sides when coming to the rail.

When the rail has emptied from the previous group, please step forward and kneel to receive forgiveness according to the following conversation:

- P Who are you, and what do you seek?
- I am a sinner in need of forgiveness.
- Do you believe that the forgiveness I speak is not my own, but is God's own forgiveness worked for you through Christ Jesus? R Yes.
- Let it be done for you as you believe. ... in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.Amen!

After receiving the absolution, each penitent may return to their seat. When the last person leaves the rail, the congregation shall rise and the service continues with the Salutation and the Collect.
